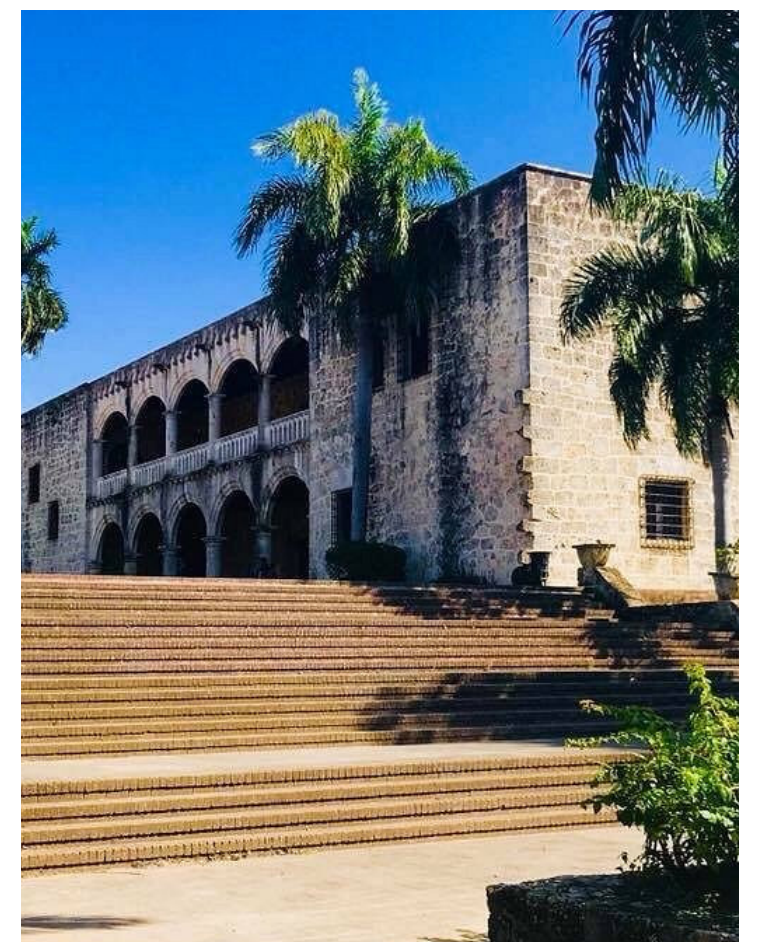

#### Day 1: Discovering Santo Domingo and Azua

We'll pick you up in Santo Domingo and take you on a wonderful Colonial Zone city tour, discovering the historical marvels preserved in its Colonial Zone. Explore the only desert in the Caribbean, its salt mine, and its impressive gray sand beach. Then, we'll immerse ourselves in Caobita Beach, known by all Dominicans for its rugged mangrove and extensive coral reef, making it a paradise for ecology enthusiasts.

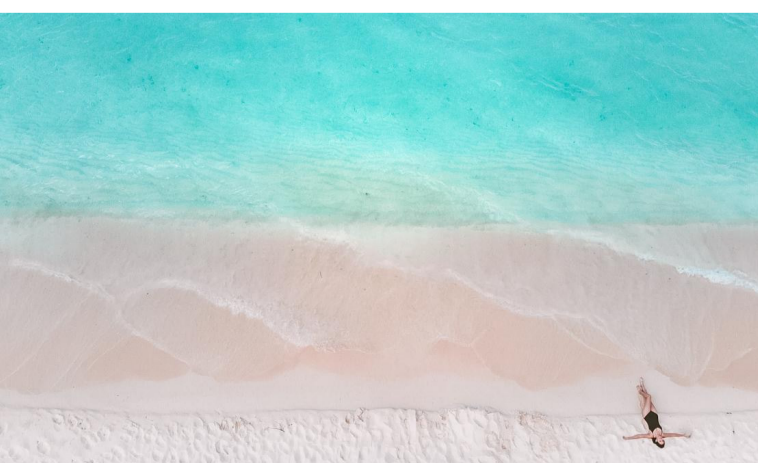

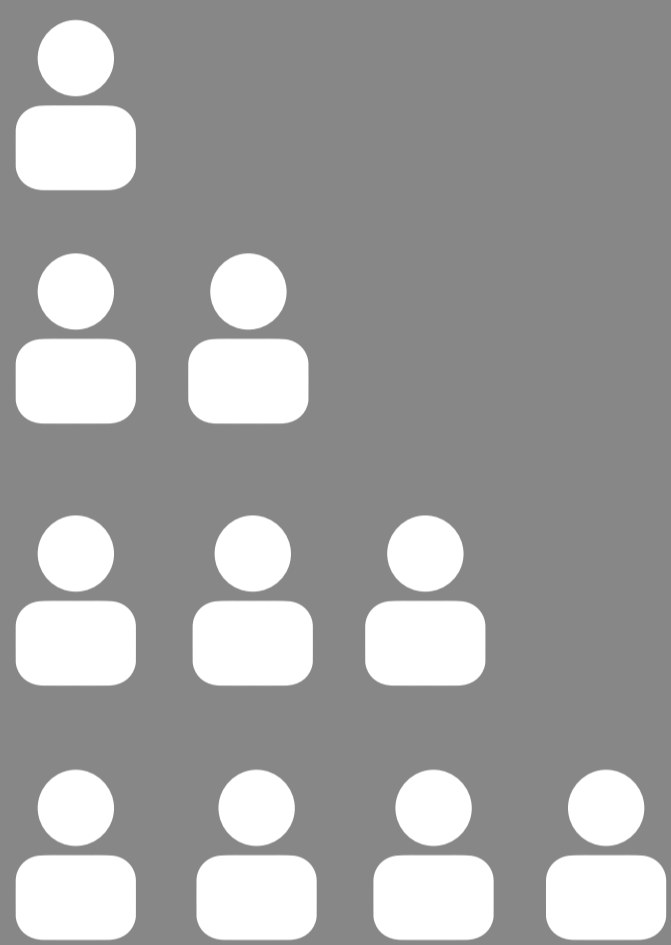
